

### TEACHER'S FEEDBACK ON THE CURRICULUM FOR THE YEAR 2017-2018

Feedback was collected from the Teachers to evaluate the curriculum for the year 2017-2018. A total of 348 Teachers responded to this analysis.

- 1. Course Content is relevant and need based: Regarding the relevance of course content about 224 (64.4%) teachers responded as excellent, while 119 (34.2%) agreed, 4 (1.1%) teachers satisfactory and 1 (0.3%) teacher disagreed.
- 2. Course Outcomes are well defined and clear to staff and students: Teachers responses were 197 (56.6%), 143 (41.1%), 5 (1.4%), 3 (0.9%) as Excellent, Good, Satisfactory and Poor respectively.
- 3. Course Content has enough Scope for development of analytical, logical, technical and creative skills of students: The statement that there is enough scope for development of Skills through the course content was strongly agreed by 191 (54.91%) teachers, agreed by 148 (42.5%) teachers, satisfactory by 6 (1.7%) teachers and disagreed by 3 (0.9%) teachers.
- 4. Course Activities (Field Visit / Guest Lectures / Assignments / Seminars / others) are relevant for development of various skills for employment and self-employment: As answered by 194 (55.7%) teachers as excellent, 151 (43.4%) teachers as good, 1 (0.3%) teacher as satisfactory and 2 (0.6%) teachers as poor, the course activities are relevant for development of various skills.
- 5. The Course / Syllabus has good balance between Theory and Application: Regarding the opinion of the syllabus having a good balance between Theory and Application, The teachers responses were 194 (55.8%) very good, 150 (43.1%) good, 2 (0.5%) satisfied and 2 (0.5%) poor.

- 6. Course Motivate Students to use various resources that are available in the college and outside for the effective learning: 197 (56.6%) teachers strongly agreed, 147 (42.2%) teachers agreed, 2 (0.6%) teachers satisfactory and 2 (0.6%) teachers poor that the course motivate to use various resources that are available for effective learning.
- 7. The Curriculum design, Teaching-Learning assessment and examination are carried out on time: The Survey shows 213 (61.2%) teachers strongly agreed, 131 (37.6%) teachers agreed, 3 (0.9%) teachers satisfied and 1 (0.3%) teachers disagreed that the curriculum design, teaching Learning assessment and examinations are carried out on time.
- 8. The assessment and evaluation system objectively measures the Course outcomes (COs) and Programme Specific outcomes (PSOs): The statement was strongly agreed by 198 (56.9%) teachers, agreed by 143 (41.1%) teachers, satisfied by 4 (1.1%) teachers, poor by 3 (0.9%) teachers.
- 9. The Curriculum contains a wide range of course under choice based credit system: Regarding the wide range of courses under choice based credit system the teachers opinion were 192 (55.2%) excellent, 153 (44%) good, 2 (0.6%) satisfactory and 1 (0.3%) poor.
- 10. The Academic freedom and opportunity available for curriculum development, administration and evaluation in the college: The academic freedom and the opportunity available for curriculum development, administration and evaluation in the college is excellent for 304 (87.4%) teachers, good for 40 (11.5%) teachers and satisfactory for 4 (1.1%).
- 11. The College has enough relevant resources which are updated regularly for Teaching-Learning Process: In accordance to the relevance resources for Teaching-Learning process, the faculty responses were very good for 189 (54.3%) teachers; good for 152 (43.7%) teachers; Satisfactory for 5 (1.4%) teachers and poor for 2 (0.6%).
- 12. How do you rate the ambience of the college for effective delivery of the academic process: Questioning the atmosphere of the college for effective delivery of academic process, the answer was excellent for 305 (87.6%) teachers, good for 41 (11.8%) teachers and poor for 2 (0.6%).
